



Simple Facial Oil Recipe Card

A simple, anhydrous facial oil for personal use - designed to be applied sparingly to slightly damp skin.

Batch size 30g	Use Face oil	Best used within 6-12 months	Storage Cool, dark place
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Ingredients

Joboba oil	Simmondsia Chinensis Seed Oil	7.5	<input type="checkbox"/>
Olive squalane	Olive-derived Squalane	7.5	<input type="checkbox"/>
Sweet almond oil or fractionated coconut oil	Prunus Amygdalus Dulcis Oil or Caprylic/Capric Triglyceride	5.7	<input type="checkbox"/>
Vitamin E	Tocopherol	0.3	<input type="checkbox"/>

Equipment

- 30ml glass dropper bottle (amber is best)
- Small glass beaker
- Glass rod
- Pipettes (not essential but handy to have for small amounts)
- Accurate weighing scales (jewelry scales are best)
- Paper towel
- Notebook for your recipe and observations

Method

1. Clean your work area thoroughly with warm soapy water.
2. Wash, dry and disinfect equipment with 70% isopropyl alcohol.
3. Place your beaker on the scale and tare to zero.
4. Weigh each ingredient into the beaker. Tick each off as you go and ensure you tare the scale before each oil is added.
5. Mix thoroughly with your glass rod.
6. Decant into your dropper bottle.
7. Label with the product name and date made.

How to use: Add 1-3 drops to your fingertips and press gently into slightly damp skin. Facial oils do not add water to the skin, but they can help soften the skin and reduce moisture loss when used in the right place in your routine.

Safety notes: For personal use only. Always patch test before use. Avoid the eye area and discontinue use if irritation occurs. Keep water out of the bottle and store away from heat and direct sunlight. Vitamin E is an antioxidant, not a preservative.
